The Will of William T D TRENCHARD

Esquire, Lytchett Matravers 1845

This is the last Will and Testament of me William Trenchard Ditton **Trenchard** of Lytchett Matravers in the County of Dorset Esquire I give unto my servants Edward Barnes Edward Miles and George fflorance one full and decent suit of mourning each to be provided by my executor and trustee hereinafter named and also a legacy or sum of ten pounds sterling to each of them And I do also give and bequeath to my female servants Mary March and Ann Giles each a suit of decent mourning fitting and proper for a female and a like sum of ten pounds sterling to each of them And I also will and direct that a proper and decent suit of mourning may be given to my Bailiff Mr George Bartlett I also give and bequeath to my servant Edward Barnes my little Waggon and my horse called Charlie with the harness belonging to such horse and waggon I likewise give and bequeath to my servant **George fflorance** all my Wearing Apparel and I give and bequeath to my **Brother Henry** with my two double guns with their appendages my seal bearing the arms of Trenchard and Dillon and my signet ring I give to my younger brother **Thomas Dennis Dillon** my single gun with its appendages And as to all the rest and Residue of my estate and effects of what nature or kind soever the same may be I give devise and bequeath the same to **James Watt** of Charbro' in the County of Dorset Yeoman To hold to him his heirs executors administrators and assigns upon trust after payment of my just debts funeral and testamentary expences and the several specific and pecuniary legacies hereinbefore given and bequeathed to pay apply and divide the same equally between and amongst my dear mother my three sisters and my younger brother Thomas Dennis Dillon or such as them as shall be living at my decease equally share and share alike And I hereby appoint the said **James Watt** Executor of this my will and hereby revoking all former or other wills by me at any time heretofore I publish and declare this to be my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have to this my will contained in two sheets of paper set my hand and seal that is to say to the first sheet my hand and to this the second or last my hand and seal the 12th day of August 1845 W D T Trenchard
